




1. Gender Distribution



2. Age Distribution








8. Why did you decide to come to Hungary as a student? (multiple answers, asked only in spring 2000)







9. What has surprised you most about Hungary?




10. What have you enjoyed most about Hungary?








17. Descriptions of Problems (only 23 questionnaires)


5. If so, please describe the situation. (only 12 answers)

- There is a tradition of not hitting beer glasses together when wishing "egészségedre" (=
 'cheers') at a table but this is hardly embarassing for foreigners. (M25, Greece– answered
 "no" to the previous question)
- Once I had to cross the room of a restaurant that was full of people dancing in a funny way (for me!) at a wedding party. I had to dance through them! (M21, Greece)
- In shops after paying you just have to get lost and pack your things on the other table.
 (M26, Finland previous question left empty)
- I consider no significant differences between Hungary and other European countries. Every country has its own specific cultural behaviour but I don't think that there are "big" conventions that can be broken fundamentally. I believe that, as a foreign student, you should adapt to the social manners of the country you are staying in. A big difference with Belgium, e. g., is that the average income in Hungary is much lower considered as a 'convention' here. But I don't think that I should therefore live as a wealthy person. My amount of money is more or less as big as the amount for a Hungarian student, and I don't want to spend more than I need to spend. So, for me, there are no real conventions in general (at least not at a first notable view after a two-months-stay here). (F20, Belgium answered "no" to the previous question)
- The only instances such things have occured in one due to the language barriers. When I first arrived here I didn't really know how the bus system worked and the rules of it. Mostly though, there have only been funny or embarassing situations because of my lack of knowledge of the language. (M19, Canada)
- Sometimes the Hungarian people make fun of my "poor Hungarian". (F23, Israel)
- I'm not used to let girls go first into shops, buses or through doors in public places. (M19, Norway)
- Only the different holidays (M21, USA previous question left empty)



- In the States, if you go into a clothing store and don't buy anything, it's okay. Apparently here it's not because I went in a clothing store here, and tried on a jacket, and didn't buy it, and the lady got mad. I guess I learned that you should only go into a store and try things on, if you plan on buying something. (F18, USA)
- I used to always go outside in winter with wet hair and my Hungarian friends parents would drag me back and blow dry my hair! (F19, USA)
- We ordered -ség (= suffix '-ness') instead of sor (= 'beer') at the restaurant. (F25, Norway)
- Instead of saying "zarva" which means 'closed' " for four years I have said "szarva" which means 'shitty'. (F24, Norway/Afghanistan)





- Hungarians seem to be very little interested in giving service or any kind of help for foreigners. (M21 Norway)
- I like Pécs a lot and I came here knowing that I would spend the next 6 years of my life here. Though, I find it really sad that I don't have any contact to Hungarians, except my landlady to pay the bills. It would be a very good opportunity for us to learn your culture, your land and no feel so much "foreigner". What I have thought several times is that maybe a first step should be made by the university and by the department of foreign languages, so that English program students and Hungarian students have the same hours of Hungarian and English respectively. We could teach to them English, they could teach us Hungarian, in a not so strict way, with grammar. This would begin a contact between us and maybe learning Hungarian would become more fun and more interesting. Thank you. (F23 Greece)
- More English in this country! More student rights! Otherwise we lose Pécs... it's a great city in a great country! (F24 Norway, originally Afghanistan)
- In general, I nearly enjoy being a foreign student in Pécs. The people are very kind (more than in Budapest). (F23 Israel)
- Hungary has been a wonderful experience and I'm going to come here in my next semester. I recommend this program to anyone who has an open mind and wants a good challenge. (F19 USA)
- I find it irritating how people refuse to speak English and at times they aren't very helpful.
 For example in my country we do not have to purchase bags at the grocery store. When I wanted to buy a bag here, the lady got really mad and threw a bag at me and yelled at me for buying it after she had closed the register. Also, when I went to get my haircut, the lady got mad when I wanted it shorter than what she had already cut. (F18 USA)
- Many more students could be attracted here by prices, and if they saw pictures of the beautiful cities. (M21 USA)
- So far it has been a great experience to study at the University of Pécs. The ISC office has been extremely welcoming and very helpful, making my stay much comfortable. I only hope that more students will come studying here from abroad and make this program even stronger. I was disappointed because it wasn't possible to enrol in some classes because not enough people had signed up. I think this has the potential to be a strong program. The Hungarian language course is very good and the other courses that I am involved in are quite good too. Hopefully in the future there will be more courses available as more students enrol.
