


Results of the Needs Analysis Carried out at Bristol University in Spring 2001.


Total: 20 answers = 12 answers from international students at the Language Centre and 8 answers from students at the German Department (Socrates exchange programme with Germany).

A. Background Questions


1. Gender Distribution




2. Age Distribution



3. Home Country








One student had German and English as his mother tongue.


5. What do you study in Bristol? In which department/departments?

23 answers: Two students studied Arts and Social Sciences, one student German and History.







6. How long are you going to stay in Great Britain (GB)?



7. Why did you decide to come to GB as an exchange student? (multiple answers)




8. What has surprised you most about GB? (multiple answers)






9. What have you enjoyed most about GB? (multiple answers)




10. What have you enjoyed least about GB? (multiple answers)






1. Were you able to get information about studying in GB before your arrival?




2. If you got information in advance, who gave it to you or how did you get it? (multiple answers)

Quotations:

Smaller groups

- A limited number of students is allowed to attend lectures (F22 Germany)
- Here the classes are smaller (F22 Germany)

- Self researching is important here. (M43 S-Korea)

- Less courses but more stuff. (M22 Spain)
- In England you need more knowledge on less subjects. (M24 Germany)

Combined lectures, seminars and tutorials

- University of Bristol has got seminars or tutorials for each lecture. In Japan we do not have a system like that. (M21 Japan)
- Lectures and seminars are often combined. (F22 Germany)

Personal tutors

- Every student has a personal tutor (in Germany not) (F22 Germany)
- Personal tutors in GB = very helpful. (F22 Germany)

Seminars are discussions

 Seminars are discussions, debates between students and the teachers, based on ist proper reflection. (M21 France)


